# Donny Osmond apologizes to Larry King after story leak

NEW YORK — Donny Osmond has apologized to Larry King for criticizing the CNN talk-show host after he revealed that Marie Osmond's 16-year-old son had entered rehab.

"I was very upset about it," the 49-year-old singer said in an interview that aired Monday on NBC's "Today" show. "I thought it was very unfair for Larry King to throw that question at Marie the way he did."

Donny Osmond and his sister, who starred on television's "Donny and Marie Show" during the 1970s, appeared stunned

when King asked about Michael in an interview last week.

Osmond said he later learned the tabloids were about to break the story. "I have to back up and apologize publicly to Larry King because I came out and said some things against him," he said.

"... In hindsight, Larry King did Marie a favor," Osmond said. "She was able to make a statement about the situation. ... And so she's grateful to Larry."

Marie Osmond, who is competing on ABC's "Dancing With the Stars," hasn't disclosed the nature of Michael's problem or where he is being treated.

### Part of library to close during Christmas break

The Harold B. Lee Library will undergo a power system upgrade during Christmas break, shutting off all power to the majority of the building from Dec. 21 through Jan. 5.

The school will not be granting access to the materials, offices or study rooms in the powerless parts of the building including the Center for Teaching and Learning and the Intellectual Properties Department.

The northern portions of the library's first two floors will be open throughout the break except from Dec. 22 through Dec. 25 and Dec. 30 through Jan. 1.

Patrons should also be aware that access to the library's databases, digital collections and the Web site will be affected by this work.

### Golden Kimball topic for lecture

On Nov. 28, the William A. Wilson Folklore Archive at BYU's Harold B. Lee Library will hold its Founder's Lecture, "J. Golden Kimball in Mormon Folklore," at 7 p.m. in the library auditorium.

The speaker will be Eric A. Eliason, an associate professor of English, who teaches folklore and Mormon literature. He recently published a book of rare stories, anecdotes and jokes by or about Kimball titled "The J. Golden Kimball Stories."

The lecture is free and will be followed by a reception. The public is welcome to attend.

### Work may lower cost of nano-electronics

A new study published in Chemistry of Materials by BYU scientists introduces a method for making tiny wires on an insulating surface and connecting them at pre-determined points on a strand of DNA.

The process begins by etching a carefully controlled pattern onto a surface using an atomic force microscope. This is done in a chemical solution that leaves a thin layer of metal over the pattern. This makes tiny wires. The researchers bind strands of DNA to the mini wires. That becomes the scaffolding for an electrical circuit. The researchers hope their research helps to develop a cheaper way to make computer chips and leads to devices that are packed more densely than today's semiconductors.
